Effective from September 2022

CURRICULUM DAY VISITS

All day visits that take place during the school day are free of charge to all pupils enrolled within the trust. This includes external transport provider costs and minibus maintenance and fuel costs.

CURRICULUM VISITS INCLUDING AN OVERNIGHT STOPOVER

Children in Year 2 have the opportunity to take part in a 2 day/1 night sleepover at Laches Wood in Staffordshire as part of their outward bound education. This is also free of charge to all pupils enrolled within the trust.

Children in Year 5 have the opportunity to visit London for 2 days with an overnight stay in the London Greenwich Premier Inn. This is also free of charge to all pupils enrolled within the trust.

If you do not wish your child to take part in these overnight free visits you MUST let the class teacher know well in advance as you will be charged if your child does not take part and you have not informed the school.

EXTRA CURRICULAR RESIDENTIAL VISITS

The following visits are undertaken over a longer period of time and incur a cost to parents. All of the below visits are heavily subsidised by the trust to enable as many children to access as possible.

- Paris Disneyland Monday to Friday for Year 4 to Year 6 pupils costing £300. All meals, coach transport, hotel accommodation and theme park tickets are included within this cost.
- Italian Alps Skiing holiday Saturday to Friday for Year 5 and Year 6 pupils costing £650. All meals, air transport, hotel accommodation and ski equipment hire and tuition are included within this cost.
- Standon Bowers Activity Centre Monday to Wednesday for Year 6 pupils costing £175.00. All meals, coach transport, accommodation and outward bound activities are included within this cost.

Extra curricular visits can be paid for via a monthly payment plan. All payments are non refundable unless the trust cancel a visit.

Monthly payment plans must be kept up to date or the place will be filled by another child from the waiting list. Payment of ALL monies must be paid in full before the visit takes place.

Please note that from the academic year September 2022/July 2023 payments can not be made by using ANY pupil premium plus funding.

5 Day/4 Night Residential Visit to Disneyland Paris

One of the most exciting places for children is Disneyland and Paris is within our travels. The adventure starts early on Monday morning and doesn't end until Friday evening. The accommodation for the week is one of Disney's 4 star hotels—The Explorers, with bedrooms equipped with full en-suite facilities and enough room to sleep 4 or 5 children. The week long fun includes:

Monday—travel to dover for a ferry crossing to Calais on a luxury coach. Evening meal in the Hotel Restaurant before a quick play in the indoor adventure playpark in the centre atrium of the hotel.

Tuesday—full day out to Disneyland Walt Disney Studios followed by a fun packed evening at Mickey's Billy Bobs Restaurant with live entertainment. On route back to the hotel there is always time for a spot of shopping in the Disney Village.

Wednesday—the morning starts with either a play in the waterpark or indoor/outdoor adventure play-park, both within the hotel complex. After lunch an afternoon of sightseeing on our luxury coach of the wonderful city of Paris awaits. We then take a ride to the top of the Eiffel Tower! Paris gifts are a must so we make time for more shopping in Paris. The evening is spent back in the Disney Village at the Rain Forest Café Restaurant.

Thursday—full day out to the Disneyland Park followed by a fun packed evening at Plaza Gardens Restaurant followed by the magical fireworks ,laser and water show. A final shop can be had as we make our way back to the hotel.

7 Day/6 Night Residential Visit to Italy

One of the most exciting and newest Visit for Year 5 and Year 6 children!

After many successful residential visits, we decided to introduce a new one, one for the daredevils amongst us—so not everyone's cup of tea!

We fly to Northern Italy on Sunday morning and return the following Sunday evening, with 6 full days skiing in the Italian Alps.

The itinerary is as follows:

- All transport transfers from school to airport to hotel and then back to school at the end of the visit.
- Return flights from Manchester to include one piece of check-in luggage and one piece of hand luggage.
- 6 nights full board accommodation in Artesina in the Italian Alps in a ski up to the front door hotel ensuring that the children spend most of their time on the ski slopes and not transferring back and forth from the hotel.
- 5 days ski pass to include Artesina and Prato Nevoso.
- 5 days ski, boot and helmet hire.
- 5 x 5 hours a day skiing tuition with 1 ski instructors for every 10 children.
- Each day consists of 2.5 hours of ski school each morning, hot lunch at lunchtime in the hotel, 2.5 hours of ski school each afternoon, evening meal in the hotel and apres ski evening entertainment every night.
- Free Ski hoodies for everyone!
- In-house apres-ski programme (e.g. quiz, games, film night, pizza night, "bottom sledging", disco night etc).

You will be sure to see all the famous characters that feature in our well known Nursery Rhymes.

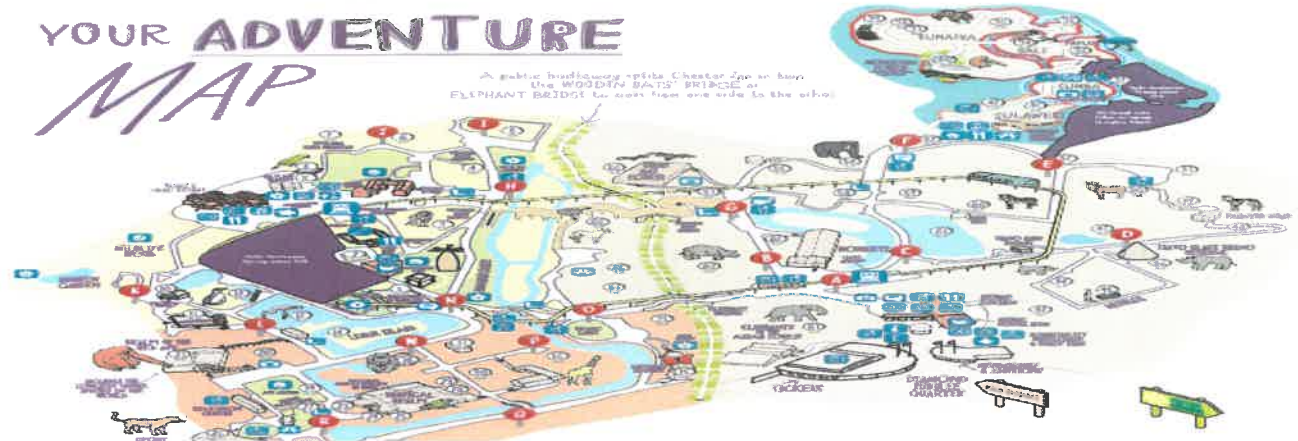

Children now have the opportunity to see these animals and many more up close! The zoo houses over 21,000 animals in its 125 acre site, so with that many animals, there is something or someone, that everyone will enjoy seeing!

It's never too early for children to start learning about the natural world and the animals and plants we share it with. The zoo is perfect to set their senses buzzing and where we start our fascination with our four-legged, two-legged, winged, scaled and finned friends!

Chester Zoo has created some truly magnificent habitats where children are able to see the nearest closest matched scenes to animals living in the wild.

There's the opportunity to see all of these animals...

- Mammals including Orangutans, Lions, Seals and Zebra
- Birds including Parrots and Southern Cassowary
- Reptiles including Snakes, Pythons, Crocodiles, Turtles and Tortoises
- Amphibians such as different varieties of frogs

They are in a far colder, snow-covered, winter wood! The Gruffalo's child is feeling brave and heads off on an adventure! In this topic the children have the chance to head off on their own adventure to Tamworth Snow Dome!

Children are greeted upon arrival by an winter character who will describe to them the wonder of the winter wonderland they are about to enter. Once inside, the fun really begins! Children are able to have their very own 'white Christmas' - by entering the snow and ice zone! Here they can create their own sculptures, give their friend a ride on a sledge or sleigh, or if they are feeling particularly adventurous, may like to have a go at going down the small slope sitting in on a doughnut! Often, the staff like to have a go at this too!

After enjoying the snow children are able to enjoy in another festivity: a short Christmas show! This winter tale allows for some audience participation and is another opportunity for children to see lots of people 'in character'!

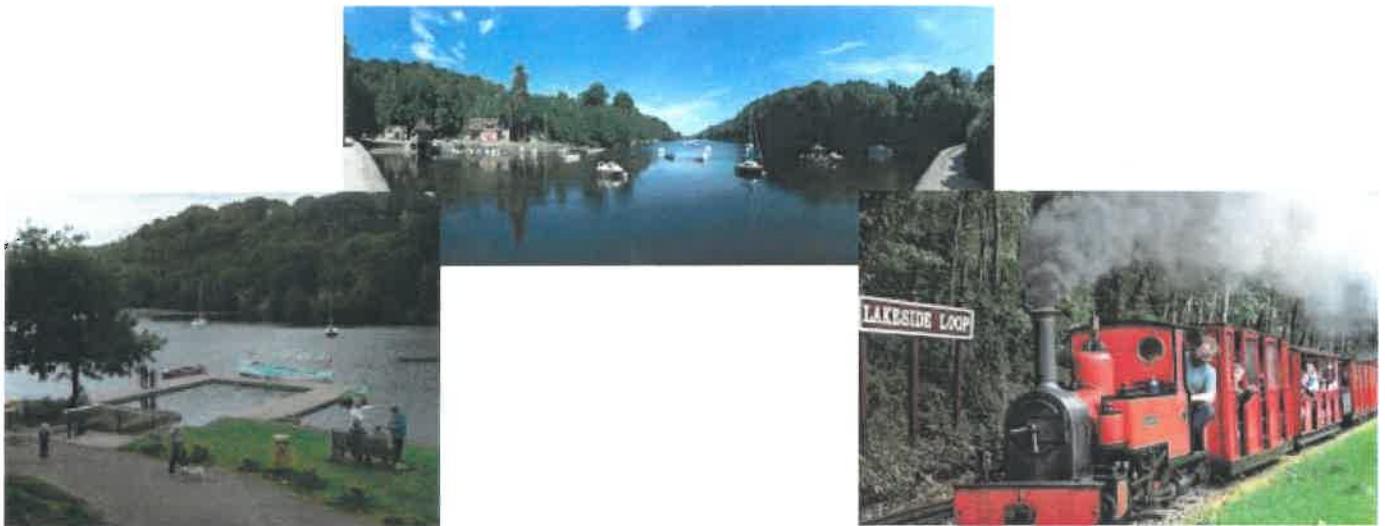
Once children have travelled to the farm, they will learn about:

Monkey Forest is dedicated to ensuring all children have a beneficial, rewarding and educational visit, as you observe our Barbary macaques living a natural life in our 60 acre forest.

There are 140 fascinating Barbary macaques to see at Monkey Forest. They live in large groups and within them we have up to 6 generations co-existing. Their mesmerising natural behaviours are on display for you to enjoy whenever you get the chance to visit.

Topic: Paddington Bear

Location: Canalside Farm, Fruit

Bearstone Fruit Farm Experience

- Paddington Bear loves a pot of fruit jam. As the children immerse themselves into the stories of Paddington Bear they will visit Canalside Farm.
- The children will visit the 'pick you own' strawberries part of the farm and will enjoy the freedom of wandering up and down the fruit field with their very own 'pick your own' basket.
- The Colours of the Rainbow workshop involves an interactive session with the children discussing, looking, touching and tasting different coloured fruits and vegetables. We start off with a fun and active 'bean game'. We get a large selection of fruit and veg out of the shop and talk about the benefits of each 'colour group' ie: the different vitamins, minerals and how they help to support a healthy body. For example broccoli being full of calcium that supports bone health.
- Children then try different chopped fruits and veg – maybe trying something new. And also discuss where and how different fruits and veg grow. We would have a look at our tomato, cucumber and strawberry plants growing.
- We finish off by creating individual posters. Following this will be the strawberry picking and the children can pick a small (raspberry punnet size) pot of strawberries to take home with them.

A visit inside Ford Green Hall—A house like those burnt down in the Great Fire of London

- Children will learn all about the Great Fire of London and how buildings were built and what they were built out of meant that the fire spread extremely quickly.
- Children will visit Ford Green Hall and see what buildings were like and how they were built.
- Children will gain an understanding about the unhygienic ness of this era, how waste was gotten rid of and the impact this would have had .
- Why did the fire spread so quickly through the houses?
- How easy would it have been to stop the fire spreading?

Location: Manchester Airport



Up, up and away!

The ultimate journey involves travelling by aeroplanes and the best place to see these is at Manchester Airport Visitor Centre.

Located off the main airport site children get to do the following:

- View modern aircraft landing and taking off—including the super-jumbo A380 which brings a large gust of wind with every take off and landing!
- Take part in a workshop on board a former Monarch Airlines aeroplane: children get to have their passports stamped (provided), take on the roles of different people on the aeroplane and this includes fully costume to dress up in!
- Discover more about the many jobs at the airport through a hands-on workshop
- Go on-board some retired aircraft to see what air travel was like in the past and is like now
- Get to see the supersonic British Airways jet: Concorde!
- Put on a captain's hat and sit in the flight deck of a former aeroplane and pretend they are flying somewhere exotic!

Of course, we make sure there's time for a play on the adventure playground and a picnic lunch too!

- Children begin with travelling around in different ways, just like animals, on the aerial trek with rope climbing activities.

- The day is then complete with a night time camp fire, where children can hear the scurrying and calling of the nocturnal animals. Let's beckon the nocturnal animals with a good sing song around the camp fire.

Children will be learning all about holidays, past and present and the seaside at Rhyl brings the 2 together.

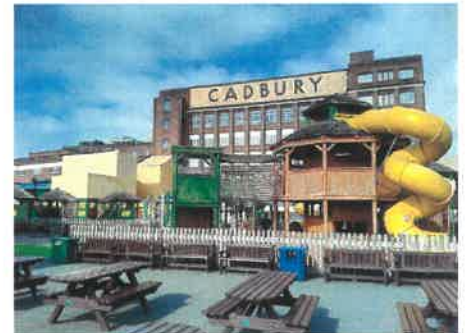
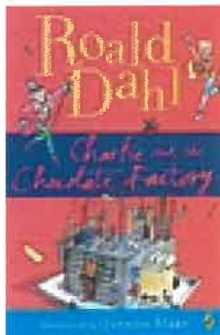
What better way to find out about holidays than to go on holiday to the seaside for the day!

Children travel to Llandudno for a day spent walking along the prom, exploring the monuments dedicated to Alice in Wonderland and have some fun on the pier.

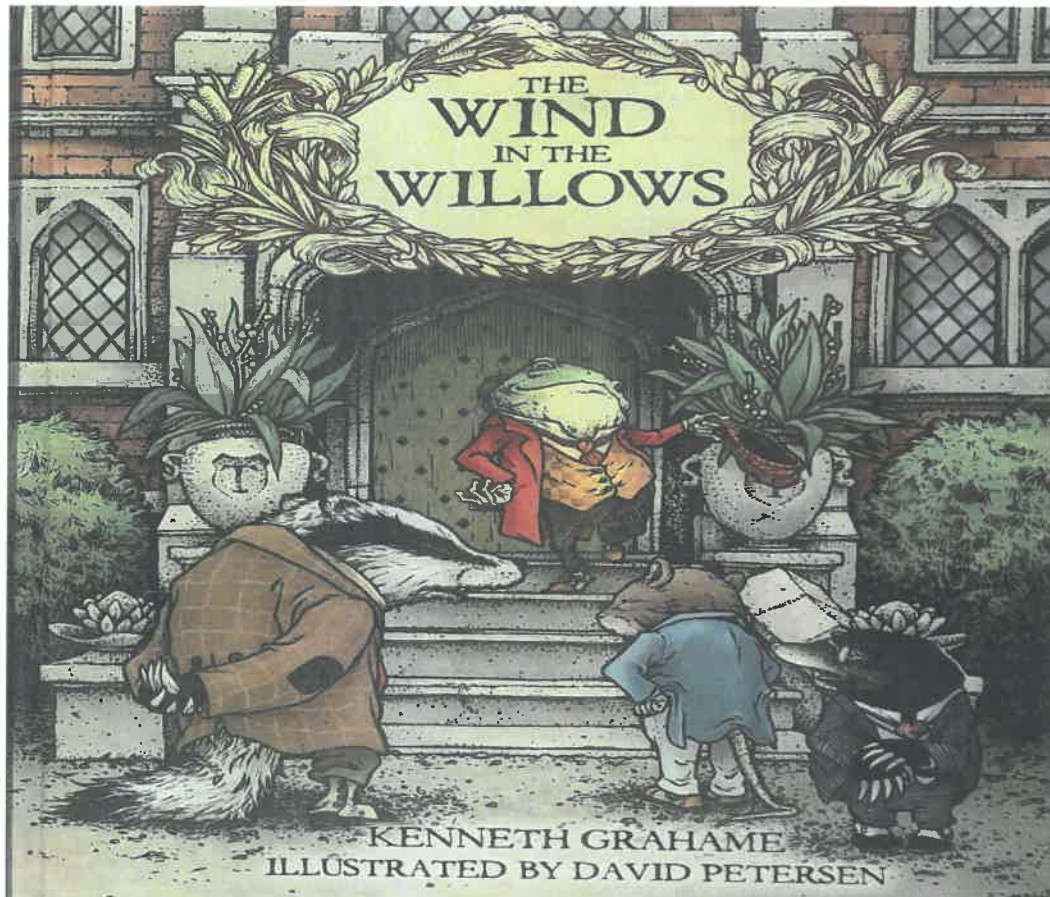
They also take the tram ride to the top of the Great Orme where the Geography kicks in—the views of the coastline from here are amazing! Where better to receive your lesson on Coasts!

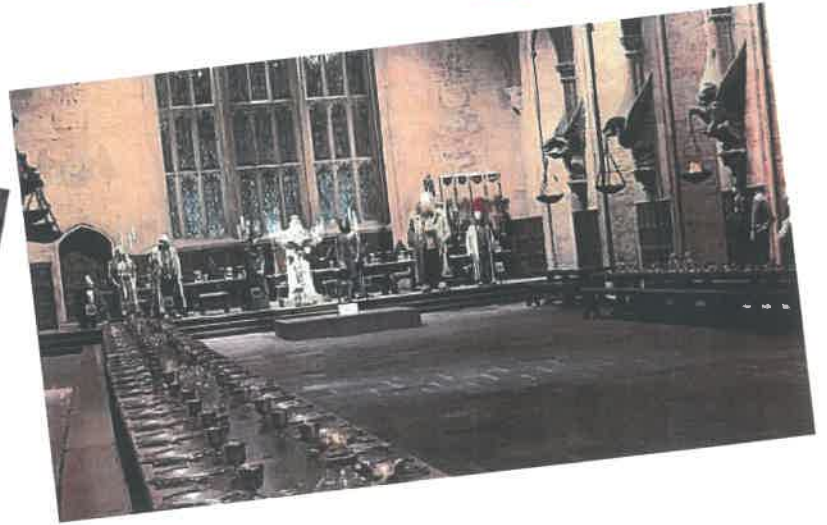
Viking historical investigation at Jorvik

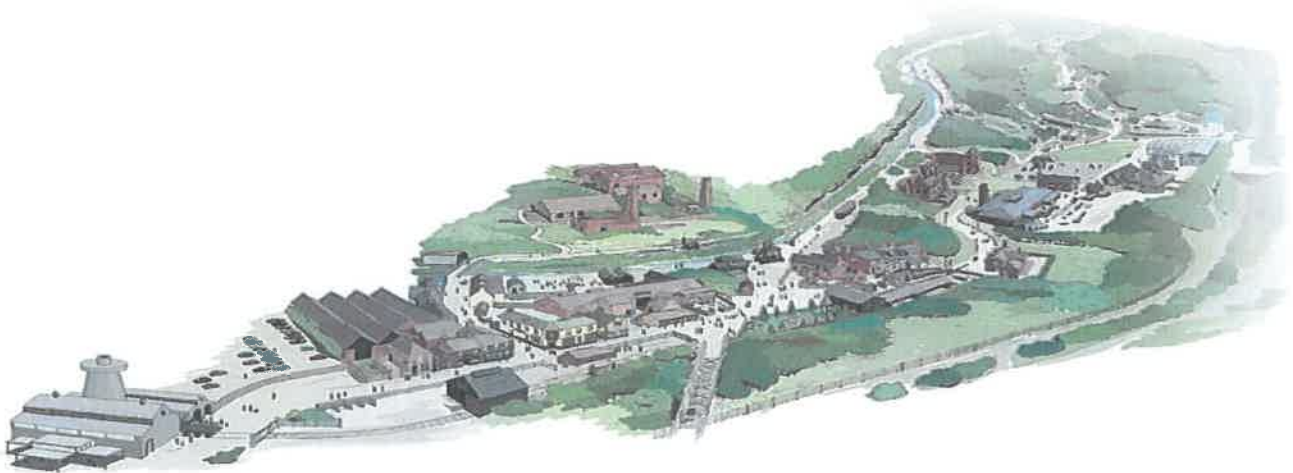
Harry Potter studio tour

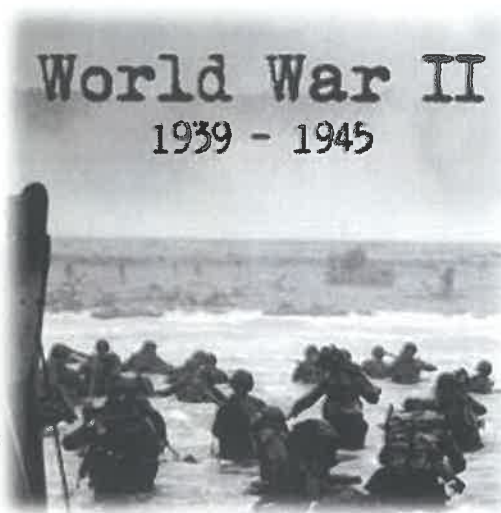
